# Conflicts today extend beyond people & nations: PM Modi

The PM remarked that this has led to an environmental crisis that threatens the planet

**P**rime Minister Narendra Modi on Friday observed that conflicts nowadays extend beyond people and nations, with humanity increasingly in conflict with nature.

He remarked that this has led to an environmental crisis that threatens the planet. He emphasised that the answer to this challenge lies in the shared traditions of Asia, rooted in the principles of Dharma (belief in Buddhism).

The PM was delivering his remarks, during the SAMVAD programme organised in Thailand, via video message.

Highlighting the theme of SAMVAD, which speaks of the Asian Century, Mr Modi noted that while people often refer to Asia's economic rise, this conference highlights that the Asian Century is not just



about economic value but also about social values.

He emphasised that the teachings of Bhagwan Buddha can guide the world in creating a peaceful and progressive era, and his wisdom holds the power to lead towards a human-centric future.

Talking about one of the core themes of SAMVAD—

conflict avoidance, the PM remarked that conflicts often arise from the belief that only one path is correct while others are wrong. He cited Bhagwan Buddha's insight on this issue, noting that some people cling to their own views and argue, seeing only one side as true. He emphasised that multiple perspectives can exist on the

same issue.

Mr Modi highlighted another cause of conflict—perceiving others as fundamentally different from ourselves. He remarked that differences lead to distance, and distance can turn into discord. To counter this, he cited a verse from the Dhammapada, which states that everyone fears pain and death.

He emphasised that by recognising others as similar to ourselves, we can ensure that no harm or violence occurs. He added that if these words are followed, conflict can be avoided.

"Many of the world's issues stem from taking extreme positions rather than a balanced approach," said the PM. He highlighted that extreme views lead to conflicts, environmental crises, and even stress-related health problems.

He emphasised that the solution to these challenges lies in the teachings of Bhagwan Buddha.

Buddha, who urged everyone to follow the Middle Path and avoid extremes. The principle of moderation, he noted, remains relevant today and offers guidance in addressing global challenges.

Mr Modi remarked that he hails from Vadnagar, a small town in western India that was once a great seat of Buddhist learning. In the Indian Parliament, he represents Varanasi, which includes Sarnath, the sacred place where Bhagwan Buddha delivered his first discourse.

He noted that it is a beautiful coincidence that places associated with Bhagwan Buddha have shaped his journey.

"Our reverence for Bhagwan Buddha is reflected in the policies of the Indian Government," the PM said. He also highlighted the collaboration with many nations over the past decade to promote the teachings of Bhagwan Buddha.

## Modi covered up Adani's corruption even in America: Rahul Gandhi

Leader of Opposition in Lok Sabha Rahul Gandhi on Friday said Prime Minister Narendra Modi covered up billionaire businessman Gautam Adani's alleged corruption even in the United States.

The statement comes in the wake of Modi's response to a query if he discussed the case of Adani with US President Donald Trump. Modi had stated that "when heads of two countries meet, they do not discuss such personal matters".

Gandhi, in a post on X, said: "If you ask questions in the country, there is silence. Abroad, it is a personal matter. Modiji covered up Adani ji's corruption even in America."

It may be mentioned that in November last year, Gandhi had demanded Adani's immediate arrest after the US Department of Justice (DoJ) and US Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) indicted him and others for alleged bribery.

"It is now pretty clear and established in America that Adani has broken both Amer-



ican law and Indian law. He has been indicted in the US. I am wondering why Adani is still running around a free man in this country, despite being accused of a Rs 2,000 scam and multiple others," he had said.

The Adani Group had denied all allegations made by the US DoJ and the US SEC, and said all possible legal recourse will be sought.

## SC extends protection from arrest to former IAS trainee officer Puja Khedkar

The Supreme Court on Friday extended its interim protection from arrest to former IAS trainee officer Puja Khedkar accused of forging her documents to obtain eligibility for the 2022 Union Public Service Commission test under the reservation for other backward classes (OBC) and persons with benchmark disabilities.

On a request from Additional Solicitor General SV Raju, a Justice BV Nagarathna, heading a bench also comprising Justice Satish Chandra Sharma granted more time to Delhi police to file its response on Khedkar's challenge to the Delhi High court order rejecting her plea for anticipatory bail.

Posting the matter for hearing on 18 March, the court extended its 15 January

2025, order protecting Puja Khedkar from any coercive step. However, the court asked Khedkar to cooperate in the investigation.

"List after three weeks. Let interim protection be continued till then provided she is cooperating for investigation," ordered the top

court and posted the matter for hearing on 18 March.

In the course of the hearing of the matter, senior advocate Siddharth Luthra, representing Pooja Khedkar, told the bench that she has not been called for questioning by the police and she is willing to cooperate.

On the last date of hearing, the top court ordered that no coercive steps would be taken against Khedkar till the next date of hearing.

Khedkar is accused of allegedly fraudulently availing reservation meant for Other Backward Classes (OBC) and Persons with Benchmark Dis-

abilities in order to clear the Union Public Service Commission exam (UPSC exam).

The Delhi High Court while dismissing anticipatory bail plea had made strong observations against Khedkar saying it is a "classic example of fraud, not only with a constitutional body but also with society and the nation as a whole."

The High Court had emphasised that interrogation is necessary to uncover the conspiracy involved.

The High Court had also highlighted that the father and mother held high-ranking positions, suggesting the possibility of collusion with influential individuals.

Khedkar is facing criminal charges filed by the Delhi Police, accusing her of cheating and unlawfully claiming OBC and disability quota benefits in the civil services examination.
